<p>All incoming guests in the frame of international exchange programs (exchange students, PhDs, Post Docs,)</p>	<p>Step 1: application Selected candidates must fill out the on-line application form available at the following link: http://www.unitn.it/en/apply/mob-in/</p> <p>Step 2: visa On the basis of the filled out application form, the Welcome Office of the University of Trento provides incoming guests with the required invitation letter.</p> <p>Step 3: accommodation Students will be contacted by the Welcome Office which shall provide pre-arrival information and instructions for accommodation booking.</p>

Grading system	<p>Examinations are graded according to a scale ranging from 0 to 30, with 18 as a pass mark. A cum laude may be added to the highest grade (30 e lode), as a mention of special distinction. The final pass mark is 66, whereas the maximum final university degree grade is 110/110.
